Capital Region Indivisible Endorses George Scott for Congress
*George Scott best represents the values of the district and will be a strong voice
for all residents of the 10th Congressional district*

(Harrisburg) July 10, 2018 - Capital Region Indivisible (CRI), a grassroots citizen action organization with members in Cumberland, Dauphin and York counties, endorses George Scott for Congress to represent the new 10th Congressional district. The seat is now held by Scott Perry.

“We came to our endorsement through a deliberative process that included a questionnaire and a vote by our members,” said Kathy Yorkievitz. “The vote was unanimous, so we are proud to give our wholehearted support for George’s candidacy.”

“We are convinced that George shares our mainstream American values of justice, fairness, equality, opportunity, and compassion and will express those values in his votes in Congress,” said Lisa Budwig. “We are impressed with his resume that includes a 20-year career as an Army Intelligence Officer and his current career as a Lutheran pastor. We also believe his priorities, which are affordable health care, good jobs and quality public education accurately reflect the priorities of the voters of the 10th Congressional district.”

“CRI believes that our current Congressman, Scott Perry, is completely out of touch with the values and wishes of his district,” said Susan Roller. “As a prominent member of the radical “Freedom Caucus,” he has voted to take health care away from tens of thousands of his constituents, voted against a bill that would have given undocumented people brought as children into the country a path to citizenship, against a bill that would prohibit taking children away from families seeking to enter

the United States, and voted for a bill that removes protections for consumers and the economy from failures of big banks. Perry's votes reveal that he really represents big industry and big money rather than the hard-working people in his own district.”

George Scott has also taken the “Town Hall” pledge committing to holding at least four in-person town halls if he wins the election. Congressman Perry held only one in-person town hall in the last 19 months, cancelling one planned for June 2017 out of fear for his safety.
