Perry/PA-10 This Week

Perry and Scott meet in third debate; final debate this Thursday

The final debate of the campaign will take place this Thursday, Oct. 18, and will be hosted by WGAL 8 in partnership with the American Association of University Women (AAUW). The debate will be [broadcast live on WGAL-TV](#) at 7 PM.

Former Perry colleague endorses Scott

In a [letter to the editor to the *York Daily Record*](#), former Hanover-area GOP state representative Steven Nickol has endorsed George Scott in the race to represent the 10th District. Nickol pointed out Perry's alignment with the Freedom Caucus, which he called "the most hyper-partisan faction in Congress," as evidence of his failure to work toward bipartisan goals.
